




Population Change 2011-2023



A Crisis Response Strategy...


- Cost Effective & Scalable

The Blueprint How Portland Must Respond to the Crisis



National Alliance to End Homelessness, State of Homelessness, State and CoC Dashboards



- Rapidly stand up a network of nighttime emergency shelters so <u>every</u> unsheltered Portlander can find a safe bed
- Rapidly deploy a network of day centers to provide a 'warm handoff' to assess unique needs, provide individual service
- Ensure **support services** to help folks to the next best step

Nighttime Emergency Shelters Are:

- Cost-Effective
- Scalable
- Return to "Stay Limits"
- Bed Utilization Requirement
- Near Transit Corridors
- Complemented by Day Centers




- Partner with neighborhoods, businesses, non-profit
 organizations, and faith communities to coordinate facilities
- **Better tracking** to better understand inflow and diffusion
- **Reunification** to help return people to their loved ones
- Return to community standards on camping, unregistered vehicles, and dangerous RVs
- **24-Hour shelters have an important role**, but emergency night shelters are the missing link
- We need solutions **without delay**
- We need a **safeguard** for individual setbacks
