HB 2948 -2 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Establishes that only a registered nurse may supervise a nurse in a school setting with respect to the practice of nursing. Permits administrator or other faculty member to supervise nurse for purposes not related to the practice of nursing.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Current school nurse supervisory landscape
- Impact on child safety and educational opportunities of medically fragile children
- Availability of federal funds to support paying for school nurse services

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-2 **Replaces the measure.** Specifies that a school nurse, or registered nurse with school nursing coordination responsibilities, must coordinate school nursing activities to the intent that the care is within the nurse's scope of practice. Clarifies that an administrator or other staff member may supervise or direct a nurse work only for purposes related to the nurse's role as a school employee but may not direct the nurse in the practice of nursing.

FISCAL: Has minimal fiscal impact

REVENUE: No revenue impact

BACKGROUND:

School nurses are registered nurses who are certified by the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (ORS 342.455). Each school district in Oregon is required to have registered nurse or school nurse staff at specified ratios for medically complex, fragile, or dependent children (ORS 336.201). Districts are also encouraged to have one registered nurse or school nurse for every 750 children in the district.

House Bill 2948 provides that only a registered nurse may supervise a nurse in a school setting with respect to the practice of nursing.
