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
#### **Emerging Issues**

- Central Operations staffing sufficiency to support program growth over the last several biennia
- Recapitalization of infrastructure funds to address increasing needs in Oregon communities
- Port funding for regional economic development
- Child Care Infrastructure established in 2023-25 expected to be fully subscribed, but doesn't address all the need
- Housing infrastructure support to provide capacity building resources for communities as they develop shovel ready housing projects


Expenditure History + 2025-27 Governor's Budget








# Agency Budget by Expenditure Category (in millions)

### Oregon Business Development Department Revenue Sources



- General Fund -\$212.4 million (8 percent of agency revenues)
  - 55 percent debt service for previous bond sales
- Lottery Funds \$200.2 million (8 percent of agency revenues)
  - 37 percent debt service for previous bond sales
- Other Funds (79 percent of agency revenues)
  - Bond proceeds from various General Fund Obligation Bond, revenue bonds and Lottery Bond sales
  - Charges for Services/Interest/Loan Repayments
  - Transfers from Department of Administrative Services (ARPA and assessments for Certification Office of Business Inclusion and Diversity); Oregon Health Authority (Safe Drinking Water Funds); and Oregon Department of Transportation (Certification Office of Business Inclusion and Diversity)
- Federal Funds (5 percent of agency revenues)
  - U.S. Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
  - U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (Brownfields development)
  - U.S. Treasury Department (Small Business Credit Initiative)
  - National Endowment for the Arts



#### **Key Investments**

- Housing infrastructure development \$106.0 million
- Funding to enhance economic development activity for Ports \$67.7 million
- Brownfields redevelopment and revitalization programs \$15.7 million
- Development of Industrial Site Loan Fund program \$10.1 million
- Small Business and Technical Assistance program \$5.8 million



#### **Key Investments (cont.)**

- Recapitalization of infrastructure related funds \$250.6 million
  - Special Public Works Fund and Levee subaccount
  - Seismic rehabilitation for schools and emergency buildings
  - Childcare infrastructure
- Continued development of Economic Development Management System \$4.7 million
- Carryover Funding for one-time funded projects not yet completed \$432.4 million
  - \$21.2 million Lottery Funds
  - \$88.7 million General Fund
  - \$322.5 million Other Funds
- Staffing investments for sufficient support of existing programs \$1.9 million/7.41 FTE
