WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure requires dental care organizations and oral health providers contracting with the Oregon Health Authority to provide oral health care to veterans, and to complete an intake screening with enrollees within 15 days of their contact with the organization or provider. The measure takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Viability of 15-day timeline for dental providers
- Department of Veterans' Affairs and Medicaid timeline requirements
- Veterans' need for dental care
- Federal and state responsibilities

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 The amendment changes the intake screening window from 15 days to 60 days.

BACKGROUND:

<u>House Bill 4095 (2022)</u> established the Veterans Dental Program within the Oregon Health Authority, and <u>House</u> <u>Bill 5029 (2023)</u> allocated additional funding to the program. The program provides the same dental benefits as those enrolled in the Oregon Health Plan/Medicaid (OHP), without corresponding copayments, deductibles, or cost sharing, to veterans who are Oregon residents, ineligible for the Oregon Health Plan (OHP)/Medicaid, and have income 400 percent or lower of the federal poverty guidelines. Senate Bill 230 (2025) would require dental care organizations and oral health providers participating in this program to complete an intake screening within 15 days of being contacted by an enrollee.
