WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure appropriates \$180,135 to the Department of Corrections to fund the advanced esthetics program at the Coffee Creek Correctional Facility. The measure declares an emergency and takes effect July 1, 2025.

Fiscal impact: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.

Revenue impact: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Tattoo removal program suspended due to COVID-19 pandemic
- Intended use of proposed funding for machines and staff
- History and impact of the cosmetology program at CCCF
- Skills taught in advanced aesthetics program

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Coffee Creek Correctional Facility (CCCF), located in Wilsonville, is the state prison for female adults in custody (AICs). CCCF's cosmetology program, which according to the Oregon Department of Corrections (DOC) has capacity for 20 students, is provided in partnership with Portland Community College (PCC) and provides a pathway to cosmetology certification through the <u>Oregon Health Licensing Office (HLO)</u>. CCCF also offers a master educator program, through which AICs who are licensed in cosmetology can become registered as instructors with the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC).
