WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure requires all legislative measures to be requested and introduced by either members or committees of the Legislative Assembly. It establishes an effective date of 91 days after the adjournment sine die of the 83rd Legislative Assembly.

Fiscal impact: The measure may have a fiscal impact, but a statement has not yet been issued. Revenue impact: The measure may have a revenue impact, but a statement has not yet been issued.

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Current law allows the entities listed below to request proposed legislative measures (legislative concepts) from the Office of Legislative Counsel.

- Members of the Legislative Assembly
- Committees of the Legislative Assembly
- The Oregon Department of Administrative Services
- The person who shall serve as Governor during the session
- The Secretary of State, the State Treasurer, the Attorney General, and the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries (statewide elected officials)
- The Judicial Department
- Any state agency whose costs are paid wholly, or in part, from funds held in the State Treasury
- Excludes the Legislative Assembly and its offices, the courts and its offices, the Oregon Public Defense
 Commission, and the offices of statewide elected officials
- The Road User Fee Task Force
- The Oregon Health Policy Board
- The System of Care Advisory Council

The Office of Legislative Counsel is a non-partisan office of the Legislative Assembly. It provides three primary services: preparation of legislative measures, research, and legal opinions.
