SB 42 -2 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure directs the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to study vaccine financing and submit a report to the Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2026. Sunsets January 2, 2027.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-2 Replaces the measure text. Appropriates \$6,800,000 from the General Fund to the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) for the 2025-2027 biennium.

Detailed Summary:

- Appropriates \$5,000,000 to OHA's Vaccine Access Program to purchase vaccines.
- Appropriates \$1,800,000 to OHA's Vaccine Access Program for operational expenses.

BACKGROUND:

The Oregon Immunization Program's Vaccine Access Program (VAP) allows providers to enroll to receive state-supplied vaccine to serve their patients. All vaccine is supplied at no cost, and providers code each dose of vaccine given to show the eligibility for that vaccine and that patient. Eligibility codes are used to send quarterly bills for patients who are insured, and the participating clinics do not need to purchase a separate stock of private vaccine for these patients. To ensure clinics are complying with program requirements, clinics enrolled in the VAP program receive a site visit within the first six months of enrolling and every 18-24 months following.

Senate Bill 42 appropriates \$6,800,000 to Oregon's Vaccine Access Program to purchase vaccines and support program operational expenses.
