# **Measure Description**

The measure directs the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD), in consultation with the Department of Revenue (DOR), the Oregon Department of Energy (ODOE), and the Water Resources Department (WRD), to study issues related to siting small-scale renewable energy facilities in critical ground water areas east of the Cascade Range. The study must explore land use, taxation, investment feasibility, and siting issues for various types and sizes of renewable energy projects. DLCD must report study findings to an interim legislative committee related to land use no later than November 30, 2026.

### **Fiscal Analysis**

To complete the study and report required by the measure, the Department of Land Conservation and Development would need a limited duration full-time Planner 4 position (0.50 FTE) in the 2025-27 biennium, at an estimated cost of \$161,487 General Fund. This position would lead the study, manage outreach and coordination with partner agencies and stakeholders, and conduct in-state travel to groundwater-limited areas.

# Other entities

The measure is anticipated to have minimal impact for the Water Resources Department, the Oregon Department of Energy, and the Department of Revenue.

### **Relevant Dates**

DLCD is required to submit a report on the study's findings to the interim legislative committees related to land use no later than November 30, 2026.

The measure takes effect on January 1, 2026.

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
