Co-Chair Evans, Co-Chair Broadman, and Members of the Joint Committee on Ways and Means Subcommittee on Public Safety:

The Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) received two questions during day one of our agency testimony on March 24, 2005. The first on the number of youth in OYA who have gang affiliation and the second on how many community partnerships we have around the state.

Gang affiliation

- The data for gang involvement comes from the Risk Needs Assessment that is completed on all youth within 30 days of commitment to OYA. The most recent data as of 1/1/25 shows that 35% of youth have some type of current or former gang involvement (30% in the community and 42% in the facility).
- We have a new Conflict Resolution Program, of which gang management is one of the three elements. There is not a specific curriculum or approach to work with gang impacted youth, so we have many strategies to meet the needs of the youth.
