Subject: HB 3230 – Relating to Information Technology: Work Session Recommendations

House Bill 3230 relates to information technology. The introduced version of the measure directs the State Chief Information Officer to contract with a third party to conduct an independent assessment of the information technology governance, organizational and operational environment within the executive department. The assessment shall identify, describe, and recommend alternative information technology governance programs and organizational and operational models, conduct a gap analysis to compare the current with the recommended information technology environment, and provide a plan, including estimated costs and timeframes, to implement the recommendations. The measure requires the assessment to be completed, and subsequently, the State Chief Information Officer to submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature by to be determined dates in 2026.

If passed into law, the measure declares an emergency and is effective on passage.

Materials related to House Bill 3230 are posted on OLIS.

If the -2 Amendment is adopted, the assessment would be required to be completed by March 31, 2026, and the State Chief Information Officer would be directed to submit the required report to the Governor and the Legislature by April 30, 2026.

Recommended Changes - Amendment
