HB 3941 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure requires the Oregon Department of Education to establish and administer a grant program for community schools. It allows ODE to contract with a non-profit organization with community school experience. The measure prescribes applicant eligibility requirements and the uses for the grant funding. It requires ODE or the non-profit organization to establish a committee to administer the program. The measure requires the Department or non-profit to consider the recommendation of the committee prior to selecting grant recipients, limits the number of grants to five, and requires each recipient to receive a \$170,000. The measure requires ODE to submit reports to interim committees of the Legislative Assembly prior to September 15, 2026, September 15, 2028, and September 15, 2029. The measure appropriates \$4,990,000 from the Administrative Service Economics Development Fund to ODE for the establishment and administration of the grant program. The measure declares an emergency and takes effect on July 1, 2025.

BACKGROUND:

Under <u>current law</u>, a community school is a program that fosters citizen involvement and provides educational, recreational, cultural, and related services to the community. When a community chooses to create a community school, a school district must operate it unless the school district consents to allow a community college, community service district, an education service district, a municipal government, or a parks and recreation districts.
