Bill Title: Relating to coordinated care organizations; declaring an emergency.

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Measure Description

The measure creates the 15-member Task Force on Provider Credentialing which is tasked with developing recommendations to expand the current credentialing database to include other types of providers, ensure the database is useable by coordinated care organizations and providers, determine the types of audits and compliance materials that should be included in the database and ensure the content and functionality of the database are accessible and meet the needs of the Oregon integrated and coordinated health care delivery system. The bill directs the Oregon Health Authority to provide support for the task force. Task force members serve as volunteers and are not eligible for compensation or reimbursement. The task force must present its initial recommendations to the legislature by December 31, 2025, and continue to report annually by February 1. The measure is repealed on January 2, 2029.

Fiscal Analysis

The fiscal impact of the measure is \$417,160 total funds for two limited duration full-time positions (1.50 FTE) in the 2025-27 biennium. New positions include two permanent full-time Operations and Policy Analyst 3 positions. One position will serve as the credentialing administrator and will ensure database content is accurate and complies with regulations and contract requirements. The other position will serve as a data systems project analyst and will support the task force in developing technical recommendations and requirements for modifying the credentialing database.

Relevant Dates

The measure declares an emergency and takes effect on passage. The task force's first report is due to the legislature by December 31, 2025. Subsequent reports are due annually by February 1. The measure is repealed on January 2, 2029.
