**Measure Description**

The measure directs the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD) to develop and publish guidance for local governments by December 31, 2026, to support the siting and development of child care facilities. The guidance must include model regulations, permitting best practices, and policy recommendations, and be submitted to the interim legislative committees related to land use or child care.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The total estimated fiscal impact is \$420,480 General Fund in the 2025-27 biennium.

The Department of Land Conservation and Development will require one limited duration full-time Planner 4 position (0.75 FTE) at an estimated cost of \$235,480 General Fund. This position would serve as the project manager and lead outreach and engagement with local governments. DLCD would also require \$185,000 General Fund for professional services, communications support, outreach efforts, and legal review to develop the model code and guidance report.

**Relevant Dates**

DLCD shall develop guidance for local governments by December 31, 2026.

The measure takes effect on the 91st day after sine die.
