**Measure Description**

The measure includes a one-time appropriation of \$1.5 million General Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) in the 2025-27 biennium to distribute moneys to the Area Health Education Center program of Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of SB 490 (2023).

**Fiscal Analysis**

The fiscal impact of the measure is \$1.5 million General Fund in the 2025-27 biennium. Through the passage of SB 490, the Legislative Assembly appropriated \$1.5 million to HECC in the 2023-25 biennium to distribute to the Area Health Education Center at OHSU to support the Oregon Academy of Family Physicians. The measure provides continued funding for the academy in the 2025-27 biennium.

The measure requires HECC to make a one-time transfer \$1.5 million to the Area Health Education Center program at OHSU to support the Oregon Academy of Family Physicians in promoting family medicine residency training programs; increasing training for residents in maternal and reproductive health care; and developing programming for family medicine residency training program directors, faculty, and residents. The center may spend up to 5% of the total funding on administrative costs, per SB 490. HECC will not require any additional budgetary resources to make this transfer.

**Relevant Dates**

The measure takes effect on January 1, 2026. Therefore, the General Fund appropriation in the measure will not become available until January 1, 2026.
