#### **Investment Services**

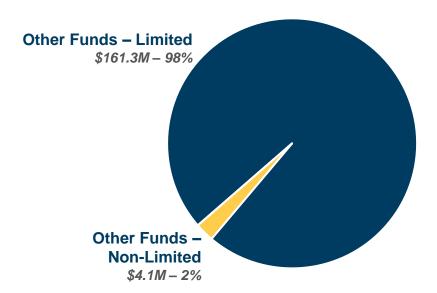

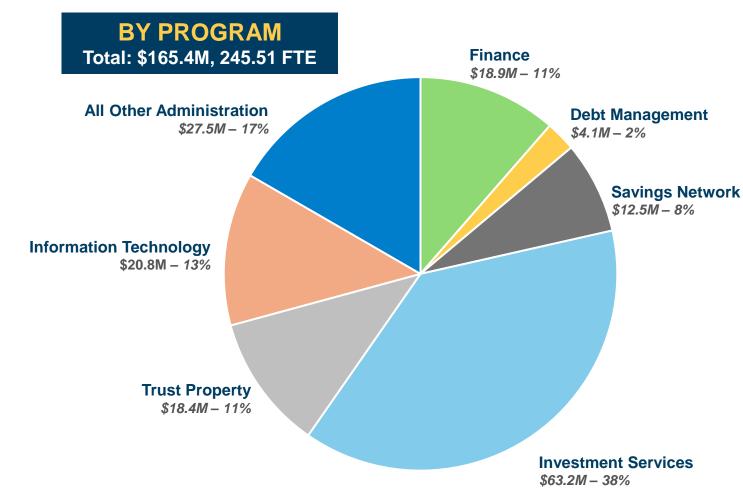


### TREASURER'S BUDGET

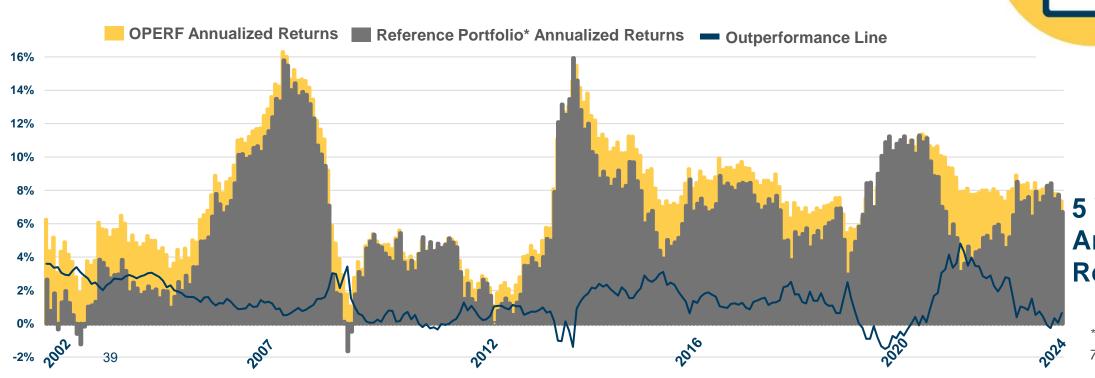

**Growth Of \$100 Since 1997 If Invested By Treasury Or In A Reference Portfolio\*** 





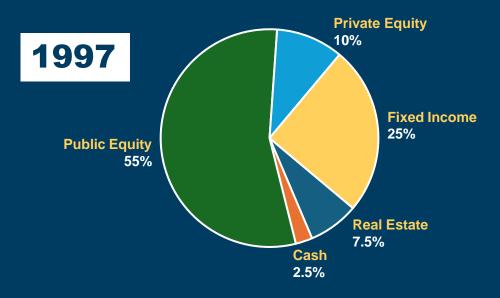

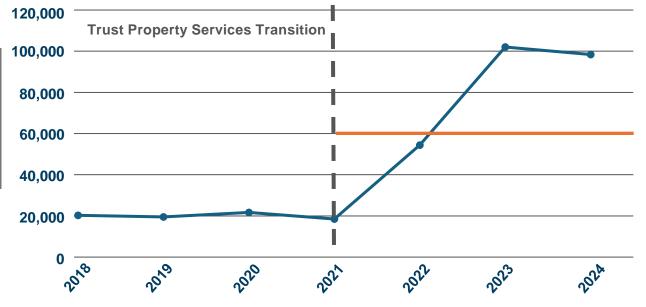
