## SB 1063 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

# WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure directs the Department of Human Services to study options for establishing a grant program to provide resources, including relocation assistance, to parents of children who have been victims of sex abuse. The measure requires the department to report to interim legislative committees by September 15, 2026. The measure sunsets on January 2, 2027.

## **BACKGROUND:**

According to the Oregon Department of Human Services (ODHS), approximately 10.5% of child abuse incidents that were founded by <a href="Child Protective Services">Child Protective Services</a> (CPS) in 2023 involved sexual abuse (<a href="Department of Human Services">Department of Human Services</a>, 2024). Among incidents of non-familial child abuse that occurred in child-caring agencies, child care providers, residential facilities, foster homes, and schools that were investigated by the <a href="Office of Training, Investigations">Office of Training, Investigations</a>, and Safety (OTIS) in 2024, sexual abuse made up 47.5% of reported cases (<a href="Department of Human Services">Department of Human Services</a>, 2025). ODHS classifies the following as sexual abuse: rape of a child, criminal sexual abuse, sexual harassment, sexual exploitation, inappropriate exposure to sexual material, and inappropriate sexual contact (OAR 413-015-0115).

Oregon law also prescribes a multidisciplinary framework for responding to incidents of child abuse, including child sexual abuse, that coordinates the efforts of ODHS, law enforcement, school officials, medical, and mental health professionals to assist abuse victims (ORS 418.746 et seq.) The Oregon Department of Justice coordinates and administers the Child Abuse Multidisciplinary Intervention (CAMI) Fund, which distributes resources to regional multidisciplinary teams (MDTs) and child advocacy centers (CACs). These entities perform forensic medical investigations and interviews with victims, as well as service coordination and referrals for families.
