

HB 3830 -1 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

House Committee On Commerce and Consumer Protection

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure defines Licensee, occupational or professional service, and professional licensing board. Establishes that an individual not lawfully present in the United States is eligible for authorization to provide an occupational or professional service. A licensing board may not deny authorization issues by a licensing board because of an individual's immigration or citizenship status. The measure requires a professional licensing board to not disclose an applicant's federal identification number except for specific instances. The measure requires an applicant's federal identification number to be confidential and exempt from public disclosure. Establishes that an individual not lawfully present in the United States may not be denied a state or local public benefit based solely on the individual's immigration or citizenship status.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 The amendment requires that for an individual who is not lawfully present in the United States to get authorization to provide occupational or professional services, the individual must have a federal individual taxpayer identification number.

BACKGROUND:

ORS 25.785 (1) Any state agency, board or commission that is authorized to issue an occupational, professional, recreational or driver license, certificate, permit or registration subject to suspension under [ORS 25.750 \(Suspension of licenses, certificates, permits and registrations\)](#) to [25.783 \(Confidentiality of information\)](#) shall require that an individual's Social Security number be recorded on an application for, or form for renewal of, a license, certificate, permit or registration and to the maximum extent feasible shall include the Social Security number in automated databases containing information about the individual.
