# HB 3731 -1, -5 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

# WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure adds to the reporting requirements related to sexual misconduct at public institutions of higher education. It requires a section for narrative discussion. It declares an emergency and takes effect on passage.

#### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

• Expanding reporting requirements to better reflect the work of Title IX coordinators

# **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

-1 The amendment further modifies the reporting requirements related to sexual misconduct at public institutions of higher education. It permits the executive summary for the report to be four pages long. It first applies changes to reports submitted for the 2025-26 academic year.

-5 The amendment replaces the measure. It modifies the reporting requirements related to sexual misconduct at public institutions of higher education. It adds both optional and required narrative sections to the annual report submitted by institutions of higher education. It permits the executive summary for the report to be an unlimited number of pages. It first adds the required narrative sections to reports submitted for the 2024-25 academic year, and applies other changes to reports submitted for the 2025-26 academic year. The amendment declares an emergency and takes effect on passage.

# BACKGROUND:

<u>House Bill 3456 (2023)</u> created a Sexual Misconduct Survey Council to develop a standard statewide sexual misconduct climate survey. It also implemented specific requirements for how institutions of higher education should address sexual misconduct on campus, including collecting and reporting certain data, providing prevention and awareness training to students and employees, and offering certain services to students who report experiencing sexual misconduct. The requirements, modified by <u>House Bill 4164 (2024)</u> and codified in ORS 350.335 to 350.346, are in addition to provisions passed in <u>Senate Bill 759 (2015)</u> and <u>House Bill 3415 (2019)</u> that require institutions of higher education to adopt a written protocol and written policies concerning sexual violence and misconduct. Requirements for those policies and protocols are codified in ORS 350.253 and ORS 350.255.

The first reports in accordance with House Bill 3456 (2023) were submitted to the Legislative Assembly in 2024. The ORS 350.345 Annual Report Relating to Sexual Misconduct from each university and community college is available on the Oregon Legislature's <u>website</u>. Examples of this report include those submitted by the <u>University</u> <u>of Oregon</u>, <u>Western Oregon University</u>, and <u>Treasure Valley Community College</u>.
