## HOUSING

Prioritize pregnant people and families with babies for rental assistance, eviction protection, and emergency housing assistance, and increase the supply of family-sized affordable housing units.

### BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

Expand availability of integrated maternal substance use and mental health treatments using evidence-based interventions including Project Nurture/Nurture Oregon.

### ENDING CHILD POVERTY

Expand the **Oregon tax credits for kids** and provide **direct assistance to families** during the prenatal and postpartum periods.

### PERINATAL WORKFORCE

Increase the numbers of traditional health workers, including doulas, lactation counselors, and community health workers, as well as peer support specialists, through trainings and financial incentives.

## Keeping Babies Housed

Braid funding between 6-month HRSN
housing benefit for CCO members and
additional support from ODHS before
handing off to PHAs

Preventing nonpayment evictions for those in process of applying for/receiving HRSN housing benefits

Allocating **specific resources within the OHCS Oregon Rehousing Initiative** for the target **perinatal population.** This would also help perinatal families be eligible for existing Long-Term Rental Assistance.
