Measure Description

The measure includes a one-time appropriation of \$1.25 million General Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to be distributed to Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) for purposes of the Addiction Medicine Fellowship program at the university.

Fiscal Analysis

The fiscal impact of the measure is \$1.25 million General Fund in the 2025-27 biennium. HECC will distribute this pass-through funding to OHSU to support the Addiction Medicine Fellowship program, which provides intensive training in treating substance use disorders. This one-year clinical program provides four fellows per year the opportunity to rotate through inpatient consult services and outpatient clinics. OHSU will use this funding to support ongoing administrative costs for the program, including personnel, services and supplies, travel, and fellowship stipends for the program fellows.

The measure is not anticipated to have a fiscal impact in the 2027-29 biennium.

Relevant Dates

The measure declares an emergency and takes effect on July 1, 2025.
