WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure recognizes and honors Carol Rulla for her remarkable contributions to Gresham and to the people of Oregon.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 The amendment revises a whereas clause to reflect how Carol Rulla's work helped strengthen the Coalition of Gresham Neighborhood Associations.

BACKGROUND:

Carol Rulla began attending Kelly Creek Neighborhood Association meetings in 2005, and shortly after, her passion for solving problems and commitment to supporting those who were unaccustomed to speaking up for themselves saw her elected president of the association. She led the Kelly Creek Neighborhood Association for three years before she began serving as its land use director, a role she remains passionate about to this day. In 2006, Carol Rulla was elected vice president of the Coalition of Gresham Neighborhood Associations, and a year later, she was voted president of the coalition.

Carol Rulla has spent two decades uplifting, informing and advocating for the neighborhoods of Gresham and helping to provide agency to all who live in the communities she serves. Her drive to help her neighbors across Gresham gain knowledge and understand how to advocate effectively has helped strengthen the Coalition of Gresham Neighborhood Associations into a cohesive community of neighborhoods and a respected, trusted voice at Gresham City Hall and within the community.
