WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure requires the Oregon Water Resources Department to study exempt uses of water and to submit a report to a water-related interim committee of the Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2026. Sunsets the reporting requirement January 2, 2027.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-5 The amendment authorizes exempt well users to withdraw up to 3,000 gallons of water per day from their domestic well for the irrigation of up to one-half acre of lawn, personal garden, or commercial garden.

Detailed Summary

- Defines 'Commercial Garden' as a garden that is used to grow plants, excluding Cannabis plants, to be sold, traded, or bartered.
- Authorizes exempt well users to withdraw up to 3,000 gallons of water per day from their domestic well for the irrigation of up to one-half acre of lawn, personal garden, or commercial garden.
- Specifies that the total combined use for industrial or commercial purposes, when combined with a commercial garden, must not exceed 5,000 gallons per day.
