SB 784 -1 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure requires the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to develop statewide standards for dual credit programs in agriculture, forestry, and natural resource programs.

Fiscal impact: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued. Revenue impact: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Ability to develop dual credit programs
- Current dual credit standards

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 The amendment requires the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to develop standards to ensure the quality and alignment of approved Career and Technical Student Organization programs.

BACKGROUND:

A dual credit program allows a qualified high school teacher to act as proxy faculty member of the university, allowing students to receive credits for the high school course. According to HECC, in the 2023-2024 school year, 29,661 high school students enrolled in <u>community college</u> and 13,168 high school students enrolled in <u>public</u> <u>universities</u>. In the same year, 7,419 students enrolled in agriculture and natural resource degrees at public universities.
