Bill Title: Relating to community violence; prescribing an effective date.

Government Unit(s) Affected: Burns Paiute Tribe, Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians, Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde, Confederated Tribes of Siletz, Confederated Tribes of Umatilla Indian Reservation, Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Coquille Indian Tribe, Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Indians, Department of Justice, Klamath Tribes

Summary of Fiscal Impact

Costs related to the measure are indeterminate at this time - see explanatory analysis.

Measure Description

The measure requires the Department of Justice (DOJ) to develop and implement a grant program for the purpose of reducing community violence in communities experiencing disproportionately high rates of community violence. The grant program is to be operative on January 1, 2026 and the measure allows DOJ to take any action prior to the operative date to meet the requirements of the measure.

Fiscal Analysis

The fiscal impact for DOJ is indeterminate and dependent on the level of funding provided for the grant program and the number of grants applied for and issued.

There is a minimal fiscal impact on Oregon’s nine Federally recognized Tribes.

Relevant Dates

The measure takes effect on the 91st day after sine die.
