WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure appropriates an unspecified amount to the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) for distribution to local health department and federally-recognized Indian tribes in Oregon for establishing or expanding primary prevention programs for addiction. Declares an emergency, effective on July 1, 2025.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued.

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Primary prevention is a public health strategy that aims to intervene before a negative health outcome occurs. For substance use, this can mean preventing or delaying youth from trying substances with a risk of harm or addiction. Evidence-based primary prevention interventions address both biopsychosocial and environmental risk and protective factors at the individual, interpersonal, and macro levels.

House Bill 2954 appropriates funds to the Oregon Health Authority for distribution to local health department and federally-recognized Indian tribes in Oregon for establishing or expanding primary prevention programs for addiction.
