




Columbia River Fisheries

Complex mixed stock fishery









Columbia River Fisheries

Complex, intensively managed

State, Tribal, Federal, & International Management

Endangered Species Act

Manage within allowed take limits for listed species

OR/WA Commission

Non-treaty fishery policy and rules



US v Oregon

Sharing obligations with Tribes

Sets non-treaty seasons and regulations

Oregon Management Framework

Commission Policy (2017)

- Maintain recreational fishery priority in mainstem
- Provide for an economically viable commercial fishery, but limit use of gillnets in mainstem

- 80/20 recreational/commercial in spring/summer
- 70/30 recreational/commercial in fall
- Focuses majority of commercial
 fishery off-channel on enhanced
 hatchery production
 - In last 5 years have allowed avg of 19 days of mainstem fishing using gillnets



Columbia River Basin Endorsement

Supports management costs

\$9.75 year \$1 Day

Free for disabled veterans, pioneer licenses, and youth

Hatchery Production



Salmon released in off channel areas

- ~34% of harvested fish caught by recreational anglers
- Allowed transition of majority of gill-nets off mainstem



Fishery Monitoring

Columbia River Basin Endorsement Extension



Extends sunset on Endorsement (2032)

- Maintains youth license and pioneer license exemptions
- Continues the provisions of SB 59A
