Money transmitter program

• Businesses that provide money transmission services in Oregon must obtain a license with the Division of Financial Regulation

• 214 licensed money transmitters (Dec. 31, 2024)

• Current licensing fees in place since program established in 2000

 License and examination fees fund program staff working directly in the program

Check casher program

• Businesses that provide check cashing services in Oregon must obtain a license with the Division of Financial Regulation

172 licensed check cashing businesses (Dec. 31, 2024)

Current licensing fees in place since program established in 2007

 License and examination fees fund program staff working directly in the program

Proposed fee increases

Money transmitter

- Increase license renewal fee from \$500 to \$1,000 effective 3/1/25
- Estimated revenue impact for 2025-2027 is \$243,000

Check casher

- Increase initial license fee, biennial renewal from \$150 to \$300 effective 3/1/25
- Estimated revenue impact for 2025-2027: Increase of \$65,100
- Fee increases in both programs needed to:
- Keep pace with increasing personnel costs of program staff
- Maintain reasonable fund balance to mitigate any fluctuations in the industry
- Without increases, staffing resources limited to what each program's revenue supports
