Addressing disparities: The black community, despite being the largest population convicted, has the smallest representation in the cannabis industry.

Educate, train, and prepare Black Oregonians for family-wage careers in the legal cannabis industry.

Green Muse Academy serves as the crucial bridge for entry-level access.

Black people constitute 2% of Oregon's residents but make up 9% in jail/prison for cannabis-related issues.

Statistics Highlighting Disparities

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The black poverty rate in Oregon is 27.38%, with median and mean wealth significantly lower than that of White families.



Despite an \$11 billion national cannabis industry, less than 5% of owners are Black due to barriers like lack of capital and systemic economic racism.



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
