Dept. of Agriculture	Regionally deployable animal sheltering kits	\$200,000	IAA drafted and funds awaiting transfer. ODA will conduct their own procurements.
OEM-ODOT/Local Partners	Regionally staged interoperable communications equipment	\$680,000	IAA with ODOT drafted and in review.
The Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs	Traffic control equipment	\$33,000	IGA drafted and in review, quotes obtained for larger items.
