WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure exempts marijuana worker permit holder's residential address and personal phone number from public disclosure.

FISCAL: No fiscal impact

REVENUE: No revenue impact

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Under current statute, certain information related to marijuana licenses is exempt from public disclosure, including business addresses, security plans, and proprietary information. This is because marijuana facilities are often targets of organized crime. The Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission (OLCC) recently received a public records request for marijuana worker's personal information. These workers may be more vulnerable than those in other industries. Senate Bill 870 adds these worker's residential address and personal phone number to the public disclosure exemption to protect their personal information and prevent it from being used for potentially criminal purposes.
