WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure increases, from one to two, the number of Assistant Adjutants General the Adjutant General may appoint from the Air National Guard of Oregon and clarifies that an Acting Adjutant General shall give to the state a fidelity bond within 30 days of assuming the duties of the office.

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The Command Group administers components of the National Guard, among which are the Adjutant General and Assistant Adjutants General. Existing statute allows for the Adjutant General to appoint two Assistant Adjutants General from the Army National Guard of Oregon, and one from the Air National Guard of Oregon.

A fidelity bond is a type of insurance, typically used in businesses, that is intended to offer protection against financial loss caused by an employee. The Adjutant General is required to provide a fidelity bond to the state before taking duties of office; current statute does not provide a specific timeframe for an Acting Adjutant General to do so.
