Drivers: Revoking Parole

On average, 3+ interventions attempted before JPPO recommends revoking parole.

- JPPO recommends to revoke parole
- Approved by supervisor

Youth Violates Parole

Preliminary Revocation Hearing

- Parole violation allegations submitted by JPPO
- Hearings Officer makes decision to revoke
- Eight days detention or return to facility

- Normal intake
 - Track 1- Technical Violations
- Track 2- More Serious Violations
- Opportunity for Formal Revocation Hearing

- · Decides to recommend release
- Determines release plan recommendations

Parole Review Committee

- Considers required benchmarks
- Determines whether parole is appropriate

A 2020 national study by the Justice Policy Institute found that the average state cost for the secure confinement of a young person was \$588 per day. From 2020 to 2024 the U.S. CPI increased by 21%. This computes to a national average of **\$713 (with inflation) in 2024 using the national average from 2020.
