


Changing Demographics

ACTUAL BIRTHS PER YEAR COMPARED TO BIRTHS USING 2007 BIRTH RATES, 2007 TO 2022














NC Reconnect: Program Overview

Pilot project began with Cohort 1 of 5 community colleges in 2021 driving toward Fall '21. The John M Belk Endowment is not only the funder but remains involved with the project in supporting each school.


Five Cohorts of 4-5 Schools (2021-2025)

Total of 24 out of 58 community colleges across the state


COHORT 1:	Blue Ridge CC, Durham Tech, Fayetteville Tech, Pitt CC, Vance Granville
COHORT 2:	Wilkes CC, Lenoir CC, Forsyth Tech, Central Carolina CC, Caldwell Community & Tech Institute
COHORT 3:	Brunswick CC, College of the Albemarle, Davidson Davie CC, Catawba Valley CC, Edgecombe CC
COHORT 4:	Central Piedmont CC, James Sprunt CC, Haywood CC, Robeson CC, Wayne CC
COHORT 5:	Halifax CC, Isothermal CC, Carteret CC, Southeastern CC

- Began with pilot project to assess impact, build something scalable, learn and optimize for next cohort.
- Each year, a new cohort of 5 schools have been selected based on "institutional readiness" with planning starting Q1 of each year to support outreach in Q2 and Q3, driving toward re-enrollment in Fall of that year and continued support of learners into and through Fall term.
- Cohort 5 of four community colleges have been selected and will launch in Q1 of 2025 to continue making progress toward the state attainment goal.

North Carolina Community colleges (cohorts 1-3) began NC Reconnect in Fall 2021-Fall 2023.

33,000

Adults were identified by the colleges as having some college and no degree.

8,600

Contacts made with adults.

20% OF STUDENTS CONTACTED... Reenrolled in the community college

Graduated within the first year
