WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure repeals the Oregon Medical Board's Volunteer Emeritus License, which allows out-of-state physicians to practice medicine on a volunteer basis in Oregon.

FISCAL: Has minimal fiscal impact

REVENUE: No revenue impact SENATE VOTE: Yeahs 29; Nays 0

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Limited nature of license and potential overlap with emeritus license
- Existing authorizations for expedited licensing during declared emergencies

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The Oregon Medical Board's Volunteer Emeritus License is available for physicians with a current license issued in another state to volunteer at health clinics in Oregon (<u>ORS 677.120</u> and <u>OAR 847-023</u>). As of February 3, 2025, there are no active Volunteer Emeritus Licenses issued in Oregon (<u>License Totals Report</u>). <u>House Bill 4096 (2022)</u> permits physicians with a current license issued in another state to practice medicine in Oregon on a volunteer basis for up to 30 days (<u>ORS 676.347</u>).

Senate Bill 873 repeals ORS 677.120 and the Oregon Medical Board's Volunteer Emeritus License while continuing to permit physicians with a current license in another state to practice in Oregon under ORS 676.347.
