Interviews

- Alleged victims, siblings, other children
- Parents, caregivers
- Alleged perpetrators

Child Abuse Assessment Process: Intervention – Protective Custody



With a Warrant for Protective Custody

- Child is not in immediate danger
- Impending danger is present

Without a Warrant for Protective Custody

- There is present danger
- Imminent physical damage or harm to an Indian child exists
