Aging and People with Disabilities

Net challenge:

\$255,050General Fund

Net increase:

\$11.1 millionOther Funds

Net increase:

\$64.4 million Federal Funds

Major GF savings:

- \$18.8 million Affordable Care Act (ACA) update
- \$6.3 million COVID-19 FEMA revenue
- \$5.4 million Estate recovery revenue

Major GF challenge:

\$30.9 million – Caseload and cost-per-case increases

Net challenge:

\$6.8 millionGeneral Fund

Net increase:

\$17.6 million
Federal Funds Limitation

Major GF savings:

• \$41.1million – Participation rate increase

Major GF challenges:

- \$41.7 million Caseload and cost-per-case increases
- \$5 million Stabilization and Crisis Unit (SACU)

Child Welfare

Net savings:

\$25.9 millionGeneral Fund

Net decrease:

\$6.6 million
Federal Funds Limitation

Major GF savings:

- \$14.3 million Net caseload and cost-per-case
- \$11.6 million One-time savings
 - \$4.5 million in lower spending on non-Medicaid medical services
 - \$7.1 million in psychiatric residential treatment services (PRTS) remittances

Self-Sufficiency Programs

Net challenge:

\$6.3 millionGeneral Fund

Net increase:

\$11.5 millionFederal Funds Limitation

Major GF challenge:

• \$6.1 million – Net caseload and cost per case

Other requests

Vocational Rehabilitation (VR)

\$3.7 million federal funds
 limitation and a net increase of
 \$3.6M other funds limitation
 to accommodate the Basic 110
 formula grant award

Oregon Eligibility Partnership (OEP)

\$2.8 million other funds
 limitation increase
 to accommodate the interagency agreement between ODHS and OHS for ONE system printing and mailing costs
