

# Community College Annual Apprenticeship Report

## Background

## SB 455 (2019)

Amended existing statute and added apprenticeship reporting requirements for community college capital construction projects funded in part or in whole by Article XI-G bond proceeds for contracts with a cost of \$8M or more.

#### **ORS 350.379**

- Requires community colleges to report annually on the amount of work performed by apprentices, women, and minority individuals under qualified contracts.
- Applies to community college capital projects with qualified contracts solicited, advertised or entered into on or after January 1, 2021.



## Background

- Community colleges are not subject to the additional reporting requirements that apply to public universities in SB 1572 (2020).
- This report covers **three projects**:
  - 1. Blue Mountain Community College Equine Center
  - 2. Lane Community College Health Services Building
  - 3. Tillamook Bay Community College Healthcare Education Building





#### **Blue Mountain Equine Center**

The Blue Mountain Equine Center capital project is a new \$13.45M, 45,000 ft² facility to support BMCC's animal science programs, our award-winning Rodeo Team as well as livestock judging and other community events. BMCC worked in partnership with the City of Pendleton, and the Pendleton Round Up.

## Health Professions Building

The new \$32.8M, 34,683 ft<sup>2</sup>, facility supports the expansion of high-demand Health Professions programs at LCC's main campus in Eugene.

- The new building allows for the return of LCC's Dental Clinic to the main campus, closer to other academic classes and Health Profession programs.
- It will serve as home to Lane's Dental Hygienist, Dental Assistant, Medical Assistant and Emergency Medical Services programs.
- Building completed: Summer 2024.

### **Healthcare Education Building**

In 2022, voters in Tillamook County approved a \$14.4M bond to construct the **28,000 ft**<sup>2</sup> Healthcare Education Building. With **\$8M from the Oregon Legislature** and a \$1.4M bond premium, **\$23.8M** in bond dollars are available for this project.

- The building will house the Nursing,
  Medical Assisting, EMT & Paramedic,
  Phlebotomy, and Limited X-ray
  Certification programs.
- It will have a 360-seat Community Events
   Center that can transform into three
   separate spaces, designed for large-scale
   events with the technology to support
   them.
- This will provide local access to cuttingedge healthcare training and equipment, eliminating the need for students to relocate.
