Subject: SB 300A – Relating to private security services

Work Session Recommendations

SB 300A refines the definition of a private security entity to be a person engaged in the business of providing private security professionals for contracted private security services, and it remove persons who simply employ private security providers for the definition. It clarifies that persons who contract with a private security entity for private security purposes are not private security entities.

Because it removes those persons who simply employ private security providers from paying associated fees, revenue is estimated to be reduced by \$359,424 for the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST). New fees for the private security program were recently included in HB 5033 (2025), the fee bill for DPSST, and the number of private security entities addressed in this bill remains variable. As a result, the agency will consider any workload changes as the bill is implemented and will assess either cost reduction measures or additional fee increases in the future.

Final Subcommittee Action

LFO recommends that SB 300A be moved to the Ways and Means Full Committee.
