Subject:	HB 2685 – Relating to cytomegalovirus Work Session Recommendations

The measure requires the Oregon Health Authority to expand targeted screening protocols for and provide information on cytomegalovirus to Oregon hospitals and birth centers. Hospitals or birthing centers within a health maintenance organization must conduct a newborn screening for cytomegalovirus within 14 days of birth. Additionally, OHA must develop a protocol for treatment following a positive screening result for cytomegalovirus. Hospitals and birthing centers must conduct newborn screening for cytomegalovirus unless the parent or guardian objects in writing.
