Subject:	HB 3321 – Relating to primary prevention of substance use Work Session Recommendations

The measure requires the Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission, budgeted within the Oregon Health Authority to develop, and implement plans that address the entire continuum of care for youth and are designed to prevent the onset of substance use. ADPC is additionally required to provide education and technical support to providers.

OHA estimates that the cost to conduct an assessment of current primary prevention programs and gaps in care will be \$500,000. The cost to provide education and technical support to providers is estimated to be \$421,232. Although the agency identified staffing needs associated with this workload, these positions are duplicative to positions that were authorized for the program in the agency's primary budget bill, HB 5025.

The recommended amendment adds appropriation language to the measure, providing onetime funding to address the costs of implementation.

Amendment
