## **Summary of Fiscal Impact**

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the Joint Committee on Addiction and Community Safety Response to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

The measure modifies circumstances when an individual with a mental illness may be detained and committed to the Oregon Health Authority for involuntary treatment, requires the Oregon Judicial Department to conduct a study relating to tribal and state interactions, and establishes the Task Force on the Intersection of Tribal and State Forensic Behavioral Health.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
