## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure directs the Department of Emergency Management to develop and implement an infrastructure improvement grant program for fairgrounds designated as emergency evacuation sites.

## **Detailed Summary**

Appropriates \$20 million to the Department of Emergency Management to develop a grant program for power, water, fire, telecommunications, and sewer infrastructure improvements at fairgrounds that are used as evacuation sites. Directs the department to develop a grantmaking process and requires grantees to submit annual progress reports. Sunsets January 2, 2029. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

### **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

According to the Oregon Department of Emergency Management, multiple wildfires burned over one million acres of land statewide in 2020. Approximately 500,000 people were under evacuation status at one time or another, and more than 40,000 people had to evacuate their homes. While Oregon's state and county fairgrounds had previously sheltered community members and livestock during emergencies, those facilities provided lifesaving shelter to evacuees during the 2020 fires.
