WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

This measure modifies the definition of brain injury to align with ORS 410.750. The modified definition includes damage to the brain from both an internal or external source .

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Needs of students with traumatic brain injuries
- Problems with current definition

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

The amendment modifies the definition of brain injury to align with ORS 410.750 and removes changes to the services required of the Department of Human Services.

BACKGROUND:

The [Oregon Department of Education](#) defines traumatic brain injury as “an acquired injury to the brain caused by an external force,” and does not include “brain injuries that are congenital or degenerative, or brain injuries induced by birth trauma.” The State Board has adopted eligibility rules in [OAR 581-015-2175](#). [ODE's most recent annual report](#) indicates that in the 2023-2024 school year, 326 students received special education services due to a traumatic brain injury.

Senate Bill 420 (2023) required the Department of Human Services (DHS) to provide service coordination, resource navigation, advocacy, and options counseling to individuals with brain injuries.
