## **Measure Description**

The measure establishes the Individual Development Account Fund, which is continuously appropriated to the Housing and Community Services Department (HCSD) to invest in an individual development account system. The measure specifies that, each calendar quarter, \$2.5 million shall be allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to HCSD for deposit in the Individual Development Account Fund for contributions to Individual Development Accounts, which are matched savings accounts for low-income Oregonians.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

The fiscal impact of the measure is \$20 million Lottery Funds Fund in the 2025-27 and 2027-29 biennia. HCSD will use the moneys deposited in the Individual Development Account Fund to provide contributions to Individual Development Accounts. HCSD currently contracts with a third-party organization to administer the Individual Development Account Initiative, which is funded through tax credits capped at \$7.5 million per year. Existing agency staff will absorb any increase in workload associated with this measure.

The measure is not anticipated to have a fiscal impact on the Department of Administrative Services or the Oregon Lottery Commission.

## **Relevant Dates**

The measure declares an emergency and takes effect on July 1, 2025.
