WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure appropriates \$9 million to the Oregon Center for Career Development in Childhood Care and Education at Portland State University to make recruitment and retention payments to child care providers. It also appropriates \$6.46 million to the Department of Administrative Services for child care workforce training programs.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Development of recruitment and retention payment system
- Proposed amendments

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

The amendment specifies a \$9 million appropriation for recruitment and retention payments to child care providers and a \$6.46 million appropriation for child care workforce training programs. It removes the appropriation to United We Heal Training Trust.

BACKGROUND:

<u>House Bill 2991 (2023)</u> directed the Department of Early Learning and Care (DELC) to commission an independent study to identify barriers to a high-quality early childhood workforce and to provide guidance for future professional development in the sector. The resulting <u>report</u>, published in December 2024, included recommendations regarding compensation, recognition of competencies, career pathways, professional learning, higher education, and research and evaluation.

The <u>Oregon 2024 Talent Assessment</u>, commissioned by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC), analyzed the childcare workforce, including shortages, wages, career skills, and career pathways.

In <u>2022, House Bill 5202</u> appropriated \$21 million to the Oregon Center for Career Development in Childhood Care and Education (OCCD). The distribution to OCCD specifically funded \$500 recruitment and retention payments to child care providers. According to the Legislative Fiscal Office, OCCD's recruitment and retention program became operational in 2024 and has so far distributed \$6.7 million of the \$21 million appropriated in 2022. In 2024, 13,500 early childhood educators received the Oregon Child Care Workforce Recognition Payment Program (WRP) award, representing providers from every county in Oregon.
