WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

The measure creates the Class C felony crime of possessing, purchasing, making, delivering or selling a pill press or similar equipment. The measure takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

Work session to move to Joint Committee on Addiction and Community Safety Response

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

In Oregon, every person who manufactures, delivers, or dispenses any controlled substance within this state or who proposes to engage in the manufacture, delivery, or dispensing of any controlled substance within this state, must obtain annually a registration issued by the State Board of Pharmacy in accordance with its rules. A pill press is a mechanical device that compresses powder into pills or tablets of uniform size and weight and can be used with a wide variety of materials, including pharmaceuticals, nutraceuticals, cleaning products, industrial pellets and cosmetics.

This measure is scheduled solely for the purpose of moving it back to the Speaker's desk for referral to another committee. A complete staff measure summary may be prepared in that committee.
