WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

SB 5510 ratifies a fee increase that was administratively approved during the 2023-25 interim. The bill increases the two-year licensing renewal fee from \$325 to \$400. Additional revenue from the fee for the 2025-27 biennium is estimated at \$2.8 million.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Last fee increase in 2010 and fee structures
- Job site investigations
- Licensing system replacement project

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The Board receives over 90% of its operating revenue from contractor license fees. Following a review of alternatives and public engagement, the Board approved an increase to the two-year license renewal fee—from \$325 to \$400—effective July 1, 2024. The previous fee adjustment occurred in 2010. The decision followed a four-month process that included discussion at three public meetings, an extended comment period, and outreach to approximately 80,000 stakeholders. The Board adopted the change with a tiered effective date and directed the agency to coordinate with an industry coalition to support more predictable future adjustments.
