## **Summary of Revenue Changes**

The measure increases Other Funds expenditure limitation by \$974,013 for PUC for one permanent, full-time position (0.75 FTE) and one-time consulting services. The increase in limitation will be supported by PUC's annual fee imposed on the annual revenues of state electric, gas, telecommunications, and water/wastewater providers.

# **Summary of Natural Resources Subcommittee Action**

Senate Bill 688 authorizes PUC to implement a performance-based regulation framework for electric companies, excluding consumer-owned utilities. The framework allows PUC to use incentives or penalties to align utility performance with policy goals such as reducing emissions, improving service reliability, supporting low-income customers, and controlling costs. It must include measurable standards and metrics, and PUC must consider customer rate impacts when designing financial mechanisms. The framework must be adopted by January 2, 2027.

The measure increases PUC's Other Funds expenditure limitation by \$224,013 for one permanent, full-time Utility Analyst 3 position (0.75 FTE) to manage consulting contracts, lead the public investigation required to develop a performance-based ratemaking framework, and support implementation through rate case proceedings, as well as position related services and supplies. A one-time Other Funds expenditure limitation increase of \$750,000 is also included for consulting services to support the development and adoption of the regulatory framework.
