Summary of Revenue Changes

SB 51 appropriates \$3.3 million General Fund to the Housing and Community Services Department (HCSD) to implement the provisions of the bill.

Summary of Capital Construction Subcommittee Action

SB 51 directs HCSD to contract with the Housing Development Center, Inc., for the purposes of improving occupancy rates, expediting move-ins, preventing evictions, reducing residential turnover, enhancing the well-being of residents in affordable housing projects, and providing asset management training to nonprofit corporations, federally recognized Indian Tribes in Oregon, local governments, and housing authorities that own or operate affordable housing projects.

The measure also requires HCSD to establish and maintain an affordable housing preservation program that analyzes affordable housing data and incentives, and coordinates preservation efforts; publicly supported housing and manufactured dwelling parks are among the types of affordable housing to be included in the program. The requirements of the program include, but are not limited to, identifying categories of affordable housing at risk of loss and identifying and aggregating available sources of funding to implement preservation investments.

The Subcommittee recommended a \$3.3 million General Fund appropriation to implement the provisions of the bill, which includes a requirement to enter into contract with the Housing Development Center, Inc. for \$3.3 million to enhance the well-being of residents in affordable housing projects and to provide asset management training.
