Measure Description:

Increases the state transient lodging tax from 1.5 percent to 2.75 percent. Specifies the net revenue from one percentage point of the increase is to be distributed to the Recovering Wildlife Fund Subaccount. Specifies the net revenue from the 0.25 percentage point increase is to be distributed to the Department of State Police, the Department of Agriculture, the State Department of Fishing and Wildlife, and the Department of Justice.

Impact Explanation:

There is no change to the distribution of the current 1.5 percent tax. The table shows the distribution from the additional 1.25 percent tax. The estimate uses transient lodging sales data from the Department of Revenue to estimate revenues generated. The growth rates applied are a five-year average excluding COVID impacted years. The revenues generated from the 0.25 percent increase are distributed to the Department of State Police, the Department of Agriculture, the State Department of Fishing and Wildlife, and the Department of Justice to combat poaching, to combat invasive species, and for wildlife stewardship.
